SCHOOL MESSAGE

We've had a busy and positive week in school and it's lovely to be able to share some highlights with you as we head into the weekend.

Our Reading Lead is excited to be offering Reading Clinics for parents and carers this term. These will give you the chance to see how we teach reading at school and how you can support your child at home. For Reception families, the focus will be on the importance of early reading, strategies to encourage children as they begin their reading journey, and an insight into the approaches we use in class. Key Stage 1 parents will explore how these early skills develop into fluency and comprehension, while in Key Stage 2 the sessions will be tailored to the individual stage of your child, with advice on building confidence, independence and deeper understanding. If you would like to attend, please return the slip that has been sent home by next Wednesday.

We also welcomed a visit from Brundall Dentists, who reminded us all about the importance of looking after our teeth. The children were able to revisit their brushing technique and were reminded to brush twice a day, ideally before breakfast to clear away overnight bacteria, and to keep going for at least two minutes each time.

In addition, it has been lovely to welcome some new faces to our team. Mr Durrant and Mrs Crosby have joined us to support lunchtimes in the hall and on the field, and we are very pleased to have them with us.
